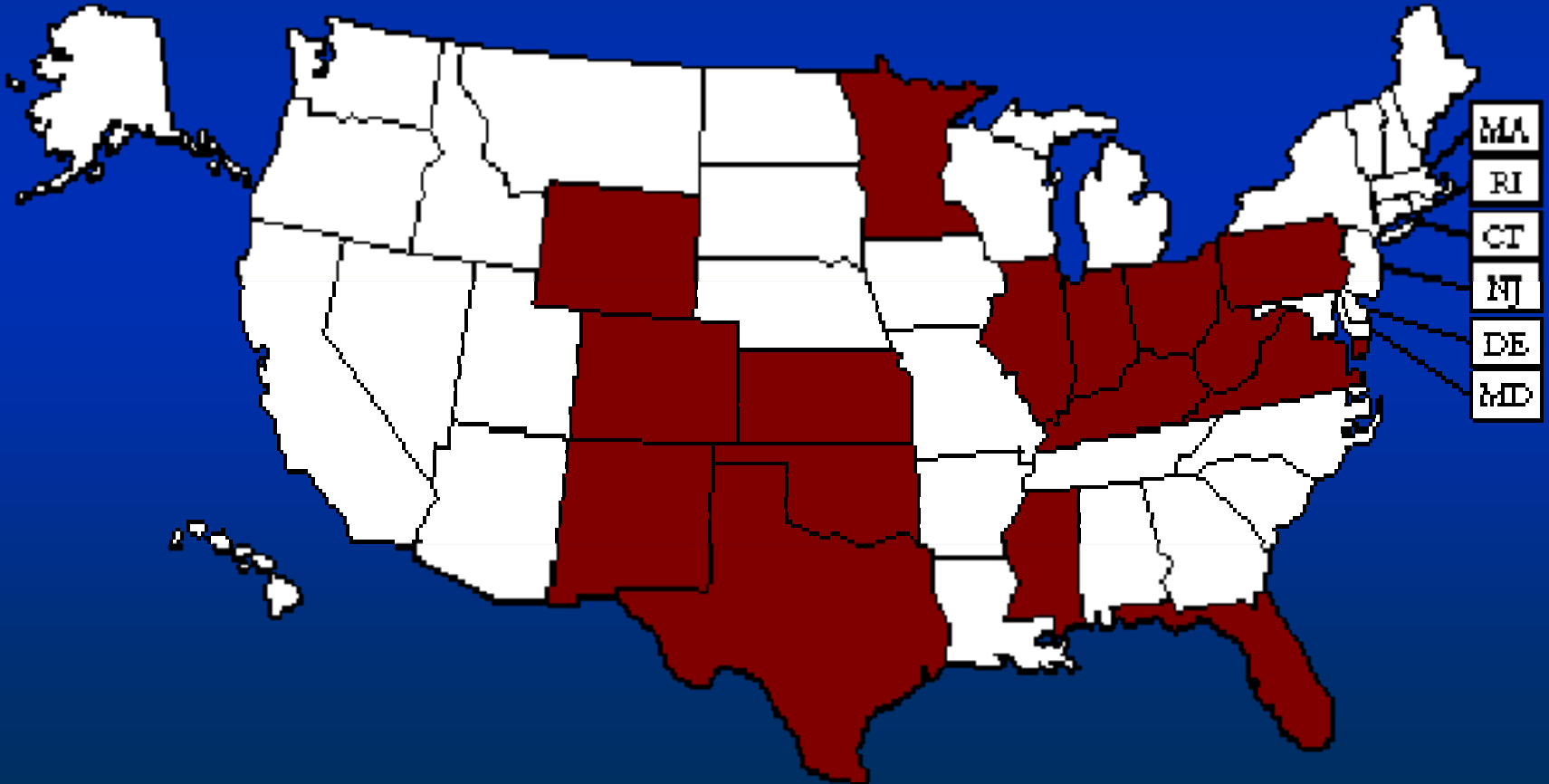

# *Colorado*

Colo. Rev. Stat. § 40-2-123 (2006)

- Approves the development of IGCC facilities upon a showing of feasibility, environmental benefits, and cost-effectiveness.





# *Florida*

## HB 549



- Revises the definition of power plants to include IGCC power plants in order to promote coal-fired power plants
- Requires PSC to implement rules for IGCC plant cost recovery



# *Indiana*



## HB 1714

- Consider allowing facilities to export electricity



# *Illinois*



## HB 3733

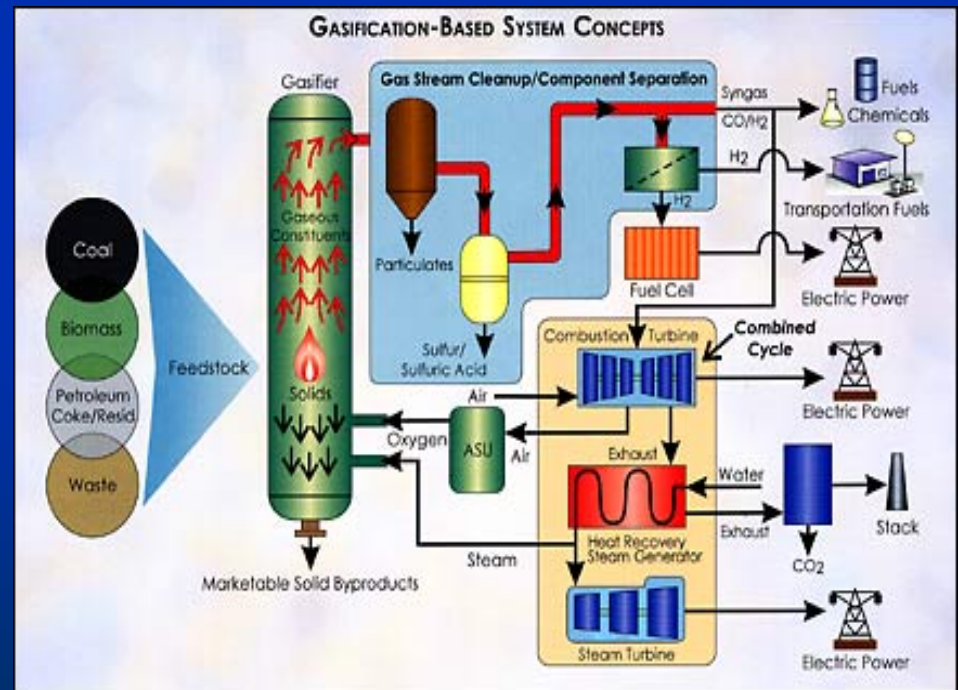
- Sets state goal that 10 percent of energy used will be derived from coal gasification



# Kansas

## SB 303

- Approved May 2006
- Tax credits for the development of new coal gasification facilities





# *Kentucky*

## SB 196

- Industrial energy facilities eligible for one-stop shopping for environmental permits

# *New Mexico*



## SB 994

- Advanced Energy Tax Credit
  - New and repowered coal plants
  - 6 percent of the expenditures
  - Maximum credit: \$60 million



# Wyoming

## HB 143

- Creates a severance tax exemption for coal produced and purchased for consumption at an IGCC facility
